Key Themes

- Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)
 - BIL was a historic investment into transit. 65 billion!
 - BIL is in the third year and bill reauthorization is on the horizon
 - BIL needs to be the “new normal” in terms of transit funding
 - Need a pipeline of projects that are ready to go
 - Application process needs streamlining
 - Need to show outcomes of funding investments
 - APTA has launched a new marketing campaign highlighting the economic benefits of transit investment, aiming to appeal to a bipartisan audience
- US bus manufacturing crisis
 - Only two US bus manufacturers left - New Flyer and Gillig
 - Biden administration taking the issue seriously
 - APTA has formed a task force to strengthen the bus manufacturing industry

Other points

- US transit ridership overall at 79% of pre pandemic levels. Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) is 100% of 2019 levels.
- WMATA - highest ever customer satisfaction, ridership **above** pre pandemic levels
