The District will pursue policies and actions that support its mission “to deliver safe, reliable, sustainable transit service that responds to the needs of our customers and communities.”

2026 FEDERAL ADVOCACY PRIORITIES

Identify and secure long-term funding for...

1. Our priorities in surface transportation reauthorization legislation. This includes, but is not limited to, maintaining or increasing funding levels for transit capital programs, including the Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities Program and Urbanized Area Formula Grants
2. The delivery of safe, reliable, and affordable public transportation that is accessible to all
3. Workforce recruitment, training, development, retention, safety, and well-being
4. Transit and maintenance operations, paratransit program needs, priority capital projects, and ridership growth
5. Addressing the District’s projected operating deficits
6. Sustaining and growing federal investments in transit infrastructure, buses, and amenities
7. Investments that protect and enhance the resiliency of the District’s physical, cybersecurity, operational, and human assets
8. Continued investment in the District’s clean propulsion technology program

Advocate for transit-supportive laws, regulations, policies, and actions that...

1. Provide the means needed to ensure the District’s financial sustainability
2. Support transportation workforce development, training, and safety
3. Respond to customer needs and grow transit ridership
4. Support innovative technology initiatives, partnerships, and investments that benefit public transit and grow ridership
5. Support efforts to grow and stabilize the Highway Trust Fund and preserve, at a minimum, the 20 percent allocation to the Mass Transit Account
6. Reduce or remove regulatory barriers to efficiently develop and deliver District projects and services
7. Avoid new, unfunded mandates and regulations
8. Ensure public transit agencies with independently elected governing boards have a voting seat(s) on the Board of a Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO)
9. Require the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to jointly establish an appeals process for MPO actions that procedurally violate Federal law or regulations
10. Support the District’s clean propulsion technology bus and paratransit vehicle service
11. Make transportation safe and accessible to all
