<p><b><u>AB 1070</u></b> <b>(Ward D)</b> <b>Residential developments: building standards: review.</b></p>	<p>As introduced this measure proposed to require ALL transit governing board members to demonstrate that they use public transit in order to be compensated for serving on the transit board. In addition, the bill would require the addition of 2 non-voting members to all governing boards.</p> <p>AB 1070 was gutted and amended to address issues related to housing and building standards.</p>	<p>Senate Desk</p>	<p>WATCH (prior version)</p>
<p><b><u>AB 1337</u></b> <b>(Ward D)</b> Information Practices Act of 1977.</p>	<p>AB 1337 requires each local agency in the state to comply with the Information Practices Act (IPA) and subjects the IPA to more types of personal information to regulation under the law.</p> <p>The IPA governs the collection, maintenance, and disclosure of personal information by California state agencies. The statute was passed in 1977 and has largely remained unchanged. The IPA does not currently apply to local agencies.</p> <p>AB 1337 would require all local agencies to comply with the IPA and expands the definition of “personal information” in the IPA to mirror the more comprehensive definition included in the California</p>	<p>Senate Judiciary Two-Year Bill</p>	<p>OPPOSE</p>

	<p>Consumer Privacy Act, which governs collection and disclosure of personal data by private companies.</p> <p>The cost to comply with the requirements in AB 1337 could be significant.</p>		
<p><b><u>SB 239</u></b> <b>(Arreguín D)</b> Open meetings: teleconferencing: subsidiary body.</p>	<p><i>The provisions in SB 239 were added to SB 707, which is a comprehensive overhaul of Brown Act provisions related to remote participation, which was signed into law last year.</i></p> <p><i>Senator Arreguin intends to gut and amend SB 239 for another purpose.</i></p> <p>SB 239 proposed to allow certain types of advisory or subsidiary bodies to meet using remote/teleconference participation if specified conditions are met. SB 239 would not apply to a subsidiary body that has subject matter jurisdiction over police oversight, elections, or budgets.</p>	<p>Assembly Desk</p>	<p>SUPPORT</p>
