Prior Board Actions To Reduce Spending on Board-Related Travel:

During the financial crisis associated with the Great Recession, the AC Transit Board of Directors voluntarily implemented measures to reduce spending on travel as shown in the table below. Travel allotments were fully restored to the full amount by the end of FY 2013-14.

Travel Price Index (TPI) | December 2023

Overview

Travel prices, reflected by the TPI, accelerated in December.

- TPI growth accelerated to 1.3% year-over-year in December, compared to 0.3% in November, a result of strong price growth in recreation and food & beverage.
- On a month-over-month basis, travel prices increased for the first time in two months 0.4 % versus November.
- In comparison, *overall* price inflation (reflected by CPI) grew 0.3% on a monthly basis while rising to 3.3% year-over-year.

Detail

Food & beverage and recreation prices rose the fastest in December, both up 5.2% year-over-year. Recreation prices increased 1.6% compared to November, while F&B grew 0.3%.

Transport prices declined at a slower year-on-year pace in December but increased month-over-month.

- Airfares fell 9.4% year-over-year in December to 3.5% below pre-pandemic levels and 23% lower than the May 2022 peak. Versus the prior month, airfares were 1.0% higher.
- Motor fuel prices were down 2.3% relative to 2022 but 0.1% above November.

Lodging prices contracted for the first time since March 2021 at -0.5% year-over-year but increased 0.4% relative to the prior month.
