

3. Update on Past Items

A. City of Berkeley Projects Updates

- [Affordable Housing Sustainable Communities \(AHSC\)](#)
Berkeley is currently completing construction activities on bicycle, pedestrian, and transit improvements to support a housing development at 2527 San Pablo Avenue and 2925 Adeline Street that both received AHSC awards. The South Berkeley Bikeway and Bus Stop Improvements project (making transit improvements on Martin Luther King Jr. Way and Shattuck Avenue) is expected to be completed in July. The Southwest Berkeley Bikeway and Bus Stop Improvements project (making transit improvements on University Avenue) is expected to be completed in July.
- [Adeline Street Transportation Improvements & Adeline Quick Build](#)
The [Adeline Quick Build](#) project has advanced to the detailed design phase. Berkeley continues to coordinate with AC Transit and other transit partners regarding bus stop upgrades in the project area. Berkeley anticipates construction to begin in Spring 2027.

The [Adeline Transportation Improvements Project](#) (ATIP) is in the conceptual design phase. We are supporting other nearby Berkeley projects, including the Ashby BART TOD with public outreach and anticipate requesting feedback from AC Transit and other transit providers as part of our Technical Advisory Committee by Spring 2027 or sooner.
- [Berkeley Bike Plan Update](#)
The [Berkeley Bike Plan](#) Update was presented to the Transportation and Infrastructure Commission on May 21, 2026, and was subsequently approved by City Council on June 16, 2026, after extensive community feedback, including from AC Transit.
- [Telegraph Multimodal Corridor Plan](#)
Berkeley City Council approved a conceptual design on October 28, 2025. Berkeley staff have continued to work with AC Transit to refine the design to prioritize transit and avoid service delays. The project is expected to move into the detailed design phase and issue a request for proposal for engineering support in the coming winter or spring.

B. City of Emeryville Projects Updates

- [40th Street Multimodal Enhancements Project](#)
Completed CEQA and NEPA environmental review and secured City Council approval of the project and environmental documents on March 17, 2026. Staff and the design team are advancing final project delivery requirements, including Caltrans and EBMUD permitting, right-of-way certification, and procurement of construction management services. The project is anticipated to be advertised for construction in late 2026, with construction beginning in early 2027.

- Sustainable Streetscapes Project

The Sustainable Streetscapes 2024 project construction is winding down with punch list work to be completed in the next couple weeks. In the past couple months, the green infrastructure facilities along Hollis Street received their “green” after being planted with species specifically chosen for their ability to both filter pollutants and thrive in our dry summers and wet winters. Additionally, the Contractor is helping to coordinate the repair of the sidewalk and replacement of the street trees in front of the Grocery Outlet building on Hollis between 53rd and Stanford. Closeout activities continue and project acceptance is scheduled for the July 21 City Council meeting.
