

On July 25, 2023 the City Council approved the following: Adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into a funding agreement between the City of Berkeley and the Alameda-Contra Costa Transit District (AC Transit) to provide an amount not to exceed \$110,000 over five years (\$22,000/year) to support transit shelter and bench maintenance

ADDING NEW SHELTERS



- Several jurisdictions, including the City of Berkeley, have asked if the District would be willing to maintain and own the jurisdiction's transit shelters.
- Also, the District implements its own transit priority corridor projects that could include transit shelters.
- The table lays out the total maintenance cost per year in each jurisdiction

ADDING NEW SHELTERS



On April 23, 2025 AC Transit Board of Directors approved the following recommendation for adding new bus shelters to its maintenance contract:

Staff recommends the Board authorize the General Manager to:

- 1. Swap the location of shelters, as necessary, while maintaining a maximum limit of 276 District-owned shelter, in coordination with the local jurisdictions; and,
- 2. Enter into agreements with local jurisdictions to maintain additional transit shelters if the local jurisdiction retains the ownership and agrees to reimburse the District the net maintenance cost (total cost of scheduled and unscheduled maintenance costs less advertising revenue).

Staff are working with City staff to discuss possibly adding new shelters to its contract contingent on the recommendations set out by the Board.
