What is Those Angels, Inc.?

- Those Angels, Inc. is organized as a California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of the United States.
 - Our school, ECOFA is the only free school in Grand Cay. ECOFA provides a 1st through 6th grade education. We are currently providing free education for 200 students.
 - Those Angels, Inc. have partnered with Sacramento City Unified School District (SCUSD) to help provide transportation for the students of Carrefour and other parts of Haiti. We are currently providing free transportation for over 300 students!



Purpose

- The purpose of the donation is to create a field program that will enhance the education of students at Those Angels Inc. established school: Ecole Communautaire Foyer Des Anges (ECOFA) and other schools in Haiti.
- Enhancing our existing school bus program that has provided free school transportation to over 1000 students since it's creation.

- The mission is to drive 3 donated buses from California to Florida where they would be placed in a ship for delivery to Haiti.
- AC Transit donated the 3 decommissioned buses.
- The teamsters provided the drivers.
- Labor partners provided the financial support for fuel, hotel and food for the drivers
- U.S congressman Carlos Gimenez, made shipping to Haiti possible

2. Gallup Express: The public transit agency provided us with mechanical support and one week later, the bus was back on the road to complete the journey to Florida.
3. Once in Florida, shipping company faced mechanical difficulties in many occasions delaying the project.

- The buses made it to Haiti successfully
- And, on March 11th, 2022, over 50 student were taken to their field trip to Haiti's National museum.
